Biblical Integration

In our 5th-grade classroom, our daily instruction focuses on key biblical themes such as Creation, Fall, and Redemption, guiding students to understand how these themes are woven throughout Christ's life and the New Testament. We explore concepts of glory, kingdom, covenants, law/wisdom,

atonement/priesthood, and divine presence, emphasizing Christ as the fulfillment of these themes and His central role in the Bible's narrative. We integrate character traits through application stories, illustrating the need for Christ as Savior and providing guidance for applying biblical principles to personal life situations. Additionally, we encourage Bible verse memorization to foster deeper understanding and spiritual growth among students.

Curriculum

Spiritually:

Students study the New Testament chronologically, highlighting it as the culmination of critical biblical themes such as Creation, Fall, and Redemption. It explores major themes, including glory, kingdom, covenants, law/wisdom, atonement/priesthood, and divine presence, tracing these throughout Christ's life and the New Testament. Christ is depicted as fulfilling these themes, emphasizing His central role in the Bible's narrative. Character traits are integrated into application stories, revealing the need for Christ as Savior and guiding students in applying biblical principles to their personal lives. Additionally, Bible verse memorization is encouraged to deepen understanding and spiritual growth.

Academically:

Students engage in a multifaceted curriculum that covers Language Arts, History, and Science, as well as Reading, Literature, Penmanship, Spelling, Writing Process, and Grammar. In Language Arts, they focus on reading comprehension, vocabulary expansion, and fostering a love for reading through oral fluency practice and cooperative learning. Penmanship and spelling activities reinforce writing skills, while the writing process covers various aspects of sentence structure, punctuation, and creative writing. In History, students explore America's history. They delve into government structures, economics, and geographical concepts, including map types, boundaries, and natural resources. Science education encompasses Earth Science, Space Technology, Life Science, energy, and matter studies. Reading and Literature activities focus on reading comprehension, vocabulary expansion, and identifying figurative language. Cooperative learning projects foster collaboration and critical thinking.

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Physically:
